## INCIDENT REPORTING PROTOCOL

USHPA SOPs require that accidents and incidents be reported so that: members can learn from what happened and fly more safely, pilots and the organization are legally protected, and the insurance company is notified should any claims arise.

- 1. Each individual pilot involved in an accident or incident, if able, shall be responsible for reporting it.
- 2. To notify USHPA, use the fill-in Preliminary Incident Report form available online at <a href="https://www.ushpa.org/page/incident-report">www.ushpa.org/page/incident-report</a> .
- 3. Inform the Club Safety Coordinator, the Club Site Coordinator, and the site landowner, of the accident/incident.
- 4. Notify USHPA's Regional Director in the event a pilot suffers serious injury or an aircraft receives substantial damage.

If assistance is needed to comply with this protocol, the Club Safety Coordinator is knowledgeable about the accident/incident reporting process
